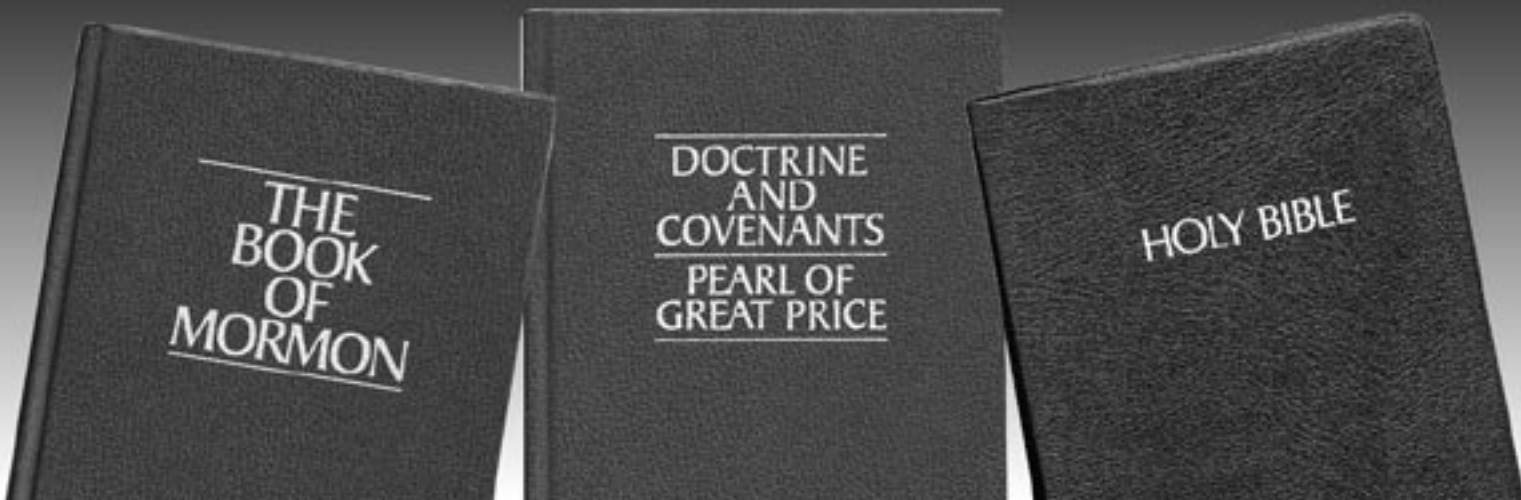

Some cast doubt on the faithfulness of the Bible by speculating, “Since the Bible has been translated and retranslated so many times, how do we know it's not full of accumulative error ?”

The answer is, simply, that most modern versions of the Bible are translated directly from the most reliable ancient manuscripts, not from older translations.

Now

While different words are used to express the same thoughts in various Christian

translations of the Bible, critics try to make it sound as if there were important differences. But they have yet to produce any tangible evidence that the doctrines of the Bible have been tampered with.

There are heretical Bibles, of course, in which important doctrinal changes have been made to bring the text in line with the unique teachings of particular groups. Two of the most prominent of these, today, are the *New World Translation* (Jehovah's Witnesses), and the *Joseph Smith Translation* (Mormonism). The changes in the NWT and the JST are said to be inspired by God but neither version is supported by the manuscript evidence.

In 1830, these passages of the Book of Mormon taught that Jesus is "God, after the manner of the flesh... yea, even the Eternal Father."

In June, 1829 Joseph Smith said, about the hand written manuscript of the Book of Mormon, "We heard a voice from out of the bright light above us, saying, 'These plates... have been translated by the power of God. The translation of them which you have seen is correct...'" (History of the Church, Vol. 1, pp. 54-55)

And B. H. Roberts, famous Mormon church historian, verified, from the original manuscript, that the first edition of the Book of Mormon was "singularly free from typographical errors..." (Defense of the Faith, p. 279).

Now

Several serious changes have been made, in spite of the above testimonies. In 1830

the Lamb of God was "the Eternal Father". In this example the words, "the Son of," have been added so that now he is "the Son of the Eternal Father."

Which God is the Eternal Father?

The LDS Church claims that the changes are only clarifications but several other passages were overlooked (?) and still present the Father and the Son as being the same God (Mosiah 15:1-5; Alma 11:38-39; 2 Nephi 10:7; Title page of the Book of Mormon).

Until at least 1837, there was only one God in Mormon scripture. But now, the Mormon church teaches that Elohim (God, the Eternal Father) and Jesus Christ (Jehovah of the Old Testament) are two separate and distinct Gods, each having a body of flesh and bone (D&C 130:22).

Further evidence that Mormonism was in the process of changing its teaching on the very nature of God is the deletion, since 1921, of the following passage:

"They are the Father and the Son: the Father being a personage of spirit...the Son...a personage of tabernacle (or body)" (Lecture Fifth of Faith, p. 53, D&C, 1835).

In the Book of Commandments, the first book of Joseph Smith's revelations, the

Lord is quoted as commanding that Joseph "shall pretend to no other gift" than the translation of the Book of Mormon, "for I will grant him no other gift."

According to D&C 1:37, Jesus said, of the Book of Commandments, "Search these commandments for, they are true and faithful, and the prophecies and promises which are in them shall all be fulfilled."

And, about these same revelations, Apostle Joseph Fielding Smith, who later became the 10th Mormon prophet confidently asserted, "There was no need for eliminating, changing, or adjusting any part to make it fit; but each new revelation on doctrine and priesthood fitted in its place perfectly..." (Doctrines of Salvation, Vol. 1 p.170)

Now

In that same revelation, on the same date in Doctrine & Covenants, many words have

been added to change the meaning, allowing for additional gifts after the translation is finished. Notice, too, that a prophesy foretelling an additional gift is added... Joseph's ordination as a preacher (D&C 5:6).

There are many other serious changes, such as these, in the current Doctrine & Covenants, the most radically changed of the Mormon scriptures. For details and documentation, contact the address on the back of this brochure.
